DATE:

The boxing competition at the 2002 North American Indigenous Games is tentatively scheduled from July 29 - July 31, 2002.

COMPETITION VENUE:

The boxing competition at the 2002 North American Indigenous Games will be held at the University of Winnipeg, at the Duckworth Center.

EVENT:

The boxing competition will consist of the following events.

COMPETITION FORMAT:

For both the boy and girl bantam age group (Junior B) two (2) competitors will box for three (3) rounds of two (2) minutes each, with one (1) minute between rounds.

For both the men and women midget, juvenile, junior, and senior age classifications (Junior C, intermediate and senior) two (2) competitors will box for four (4) rounds of two (2) minutes each, with one (1) minute between rounds.

OFFICIALS:

The referees and judges will be designated by the Host Society and approved by the Manitoba Amateur Boxing Association. All referees and judges must have a minimum National level four (4) certification.

PARTICIPANTS:

Number of Athletes:

Each Province, Territory, and State may enter one (1) male and one (1) female in each weight division for each age classification. (This to be finalized depending on the advance entry numbers)

Number of Coaches:

Each Province, Territory and State may accredit two (2) coaches and one (1) manager for the entire team roster. The staff composition must have a minimum of one (1) female.

GENERAL RULES:

The most recent version of the Association Internationale de Boxe Amateur (AIBA) rules will apply to the NAIG boxing competition.

COMPETITION RULES:

Bouts between females and males are not permitted.

Female competitors shall be accompanied by a female coach or a female official when attending the medical examination and weigh in. Medical and weigh INS shall be conducted out of view of members of the opposite sex, with the exception of the attending doctors.

Female competitors shall report to the attending medical officer regarding any menstrual irregularities, particularly the presence of amenorrhea (loss of menstruation).

When a female boxer is down twice in one round as a result of blows to the head, the bout shall be stopped. The boxer receiving the blows shall lose the contest by RSC (H).

When a male boxer is down three (3) times in bout from blows to the head or body, the bout shall be stopped. The boxer receiving the blows shall lose the contest by RSC (H) or RSC depending on the area of blows.

FIELD OF PLAY REQUIREMENTS/EQUIPMENT;

All equipment must comply with the rules and regulations of the Association Internationale de Boxe Amateur (AIBA). The Host Society will provide gloves and headgear for the boxers.

A boxer is not allowed to wear his or her own gloves in competition. Gloves with attached thumb are permitted. The regular hitting surface of the gloves must be marked in white. Male boxers under

45.3 kg may use 8 ounce gloves All female boxer gloves shall weight no more than 10 ounces. The wearing of an approved, well fitting breast protector is mandatory for all female boxers.

A bandage of the Velpeau type not to exceed 2m tapes, rubber or adhesive, 7.5cm (3 inches) long and 2.5cm (1 inch) wide may be used at the upper wrist to secure the bandages.

No tape or bandage may be place between the fingers of either hand.

A boxer's bandages will be examined under the direction of the office-in-charge before gloves are put on.
