

2002 North American Indigenous Games Sport Technical Package
Tae Kwon Do

DATE:

The Tae Kwon Do competition at the 2002 North American Indigenous Games is tentatively scheduled from July 30 to July 31, 2002.

COMPETITION VENUE:

The Tae Kwon Do competition at the 2002 North American Indigenous Games will be held at Daniel MacIntrye School.

EVENT:

The NAIG Tae Kwon Do competition consists of both male and female individual competition for the junior age athletes (athletes age 13,14,15) and senior age athletes (athletes 16 years and older).

COMPETITION FORMAT:

For color belt competitors, sparring preliminaries shall consist of two (2) rounds of one and a half (1.5) minutes. A sparring final shall follow the same format. A rest interval of thirty (30) seconds shall be allocated between bouts.

For black belt competitors a sparring preliminary shall consist of two (2) rounds of two (2) minutes. A sparring final bout shall be three (3) rounds of two (2) minutes. A rest interval of one (1) minute shall be allocated between rounds.

OFFICIALS:

updated as of September 18, 2001

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All officials will be designated by the Host Society and approved by WTF Tae Kwon Do Federation of Manitoba. The referring for sparring must have a minimum level National Referee certification. The three (3) judges for sparring must have a minimum level Provincial Referee certification.

All judges must be a minimum of 1st Dan Black Belt with the more senior Dan's being in charge of the rings. Ie. referees

PARTICIPANTS:

Number of Competitors

Each Province, Territory and State may enter two (2) male and two (2) female athletes per age group per combined weight class: 2 per finweight/flyweight and 2 per bantamweight/featherweight, 2 per lightweight/welterweight, 2 per middleweight/heavyweight.

Number of Coaches:

Each Province, Territory and State may accredit two (2) coaches and one (1) manager for the entire team roster. The staff composition must have a minimum of one (1) female staff.

GENERAL RULES:

The most recent version of the World Tae Kwon Do Federation as per the WTF Tae Kwon Do Federation of Canada will apply to the NAIG Tae Kwon Do competition.

FIELD OF PLAY REQUIREMENTS/EQUIPMENT:

All equipment shall comply with the World Tae Kwon Do Federation as per the WTF Tae Kwon Do Federation of Canada. The Tae Kwon Do competitors must and wear shin pads, arms pads and for the men -jock protectors. The Host Society will provide chest protectors, and headgear.

COMPETITION RULES:

For the sparring competition, there shall be no kicks or punches below the waist. Full contact sparring will be in effect. No hand blows to the head or face will be permitted, however kicks to the head and face will be allowed.

For black belt sparring there will be three (3) judges plus a central referee.

A competitor shall be awarded one (1) point for techniques successfully executed.

A competitor shall be deducted one (1) point for each of the eight (8) Keum Jum.

A competitor shall be deducted one half (.5) point for each of the thirteen (13) Kyong Go (warning). A minimum of two (2) warnings must be given before one (1) point is deducted.

A competitor shall be disqualified when three (3) points have been deducted in a round.

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For the pattern competition, the color belts official patterns shall be those recognized by the World Tae Kwon Do Federation.

The yellow belts and green stripes shall perform Tae Geux 1-2 Jang.

The green belts and blue stripes shall perform Tae Geux 3-4 Jang.

The blue belts and red stripes shall perform Tae Geux 5-6 Jang.

The red belts and black stripes shall perform Tae Geux 7-8 Jang.

The black belts first dan shall perform Koryo.

The black belts second dan shall perform Kum Kahng.

The black belts third dan shall perform Tae Beck.

The black belts fourth dan shall perform Pyong Won.

All patterns will be recognized under the World Tae Kwon Do Federation.

After the judges have added up their scores the referee will review scores and indicate winner by raising the winning competitor's hand.

No ties will be allowed in the event of a score tie by a judge he/she must decide who is the winner based on overall best technique.
